### Impact of premium use 2023-24

Impact on pupils' participation:	<p>We continue to enter a significant amount of Cheshire Oaks schools' partnership events.</p> <p>We have been able to offer our pupils extra-curricular activities, introduce them to non-traditional sports like dance and martial arts (Judo) which can attract pupils who aren't interested in mainstream sports. This diversity allows students with varying interests and abilities to find something they enjoy, fostering more inclusive participation.</p> <p>The funding has also allowed for the development of the PE lead. Well-trained leaders can offer varied, tailored programs that appeal to a wider group of pupils, potentially increasing overall participation.</p>
How the premium has allowed pupils to develop active lifestyles:	<p>Healthy, active lifestyles are important to us at Cambridge Road as well as the education on health and wellbeing, helping students understand the importance of physical activity in a healthy lifestyle. This knowledge can encourage pupils to participate more actively, especially when they see the benefits for their physical and mental health. External sports companies have delivered assemblies and workshops to promote healthy eating and lifestyles.</p>
How the school will sustain the improvements:	<p>Cambridge Road continues to be committed to PE and school sport as our ultimate aim is to make sports and physical activity more inclusive, enjoyable, and accessible, which can significantly increase participation levels among pupils, especially those who may otherwise feel disengaged or underrepresented in traditional PE settings.</p>
