The attendance for November is 94.6%



In Autumn 1, **113** individualised emails were sent out to parents celebrating their child's **100% attendance!** One child from each class won a £20 gift voucher.

The key message in the email was how these children have gained the full educational experience, actively participating in daily lessons, and developing

strong connections with their teachers and peers. Regular attendance also helps build routines and fosters positive habits essential for success in school and beyond.
